Satan's Four Lies About the Bible

Editorial — House to House, Heart to Heart

The devil is a liar (John 8:44). He lies about God (He's not there; doesn't care). He lies about Jesus (He never lived; still in the grave). He lies about you (insignificant; in control). He lies about the Bible.

THE BIBLE IS TOO BIG TO BOTHER

Most Bibles are over 1,000 pages, which can be intimidating. Those pages contain

- 66 books (double the 30 in most personal libraries);
- 1,189 chapters (more than all the verses of all 305 Beatles' songs combined);
- 31,102 verses (24,866 more than the Quran);
- 773,746 words (more than the 717,020 in the first five Harry Potter books combined).

Yet the Bible is about the same size as most books on a library shelf. Unless it is a tabletop or large print edition, it easily fits in a backpack or purse.

Most read the equivalent of the Bible each year. The average American reads four books a year plus 3,000 forms/notices, 100 newspapers/RSS feeds, and 36 magazines/blogs.

The Bible fits with modern reading habits. Many spread reading over different formats, including e-books and audiobooks. The Bible is available in these formats. Many read in small doses. The Bible is divided into books, chapters, and verses. Thirty-four of its books can be read in less than 45 minutes; 29 in under 20; 17 in under twelve; and, five in five minutes or less. Its 32 longer books are divided into chapters that average only 26 verses. (Continued on page 2)

Since the Bible is too big to be mastered in one reading (it takes 70 hours to read all of it), the solution is to read a little at a time, for the rest of life. The "sum" of God's word is truth (Psalm 119:160), so one should add a little knowledge each day (2 Peter 1:5).

Start by reading the foundational chapters in Genesis 1-12 and the early chapter of Exodus 1 -20. Then move on to the story of Jesus' life as told in Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John. These narratives will give you the background to understand Acts. This will equip you to be better able to understand the teaching given in the rest of the New Testament.

One can read at whatever pace fits his/her learning style. Here is one plan:

- Listen 12 minutes/day, for 12 months to complete the whole Bible in a year.
- Four chapters/day finishes Bible in 298 days.
- Nine chapters/day finishes New Testament in 29 days.
- Three chapters/day finishes Old Testament in 310 days.
- If you are ambitious, read twelve chapters a day (three OT and nine NT) and finish the whole Bible once a year and the New Testament once a month.

DedicatedChase Green

Those of us who are college sports fans probably have noticed an increasing problem in the sports world. College athletic event attendance has decreased rapidly over the last decade or so. Even tremendously successful college football programs have reported drops in fan attendance in recent years.

Many blame such attendance drops to things like high ticket, concessions, and parking prices; increasing ability to watch games from the comfort of one's home; etc. While these are certainly contributing factors, I think there is a much bigger issue here — People in our society are becoming less and less dedicated to their teams. Loyalty is becoming a thing of the past. School spirit is slowly dying as fans become less and less passionate about their teams.

While admittedly sometimes fans become TOO passionate to the point of making their team an idol, there is nothing wrong with fans passionately supporting their teams, willing them on to victory by showing up to the stadium and loudly supporting the team. But this is becoming less and less common.

Again, I believe it is because we as a society are becoming less and less dedicated. In the grand scheme of things, it's not really that big of an issue ... for sports... But what about when this type of mentality begins to affect the church?

Is it just me, or is it the case that people seem to be getting less and less dedicated to the church? You know what I mean. In many places, Bible class and worship attendance continues to shrink, church budgets are having to be adjusted for lack of needed funds, church members make excuses for not attending/being involved, such as, "My kids don't sleep at night," or "We have too much homework," or "Sunday is my only day off/chance to sleep in."

Quite simply put, excuses like this point to a lack of dedication to Christ and His church. Just as attending sporting events in person is being replaced by the modern convenience of watching the game at home on the big screen, so are Christians today skipping out on active Christianity by replacing it with things that are "more convenient." The mindset of many is as follows: "Why would I want to assemble with the saints, when I can watch a sermon from home with the wife and kids and call it a day? After all, 'where two or more are gathered!" (That is a gross misapplication of that verse by the way!)

I think we need to re-teach our young people what it means to be committed to the Lord. We need to show them by example that, say, a Gospel Meeting takes precedence over ball practice. We need to show them that, whenever the church meets, we will be there. Whenever the church fellowships, we'll be there. Whenever the church is out working, we will be working right alongside them. Chances are that our children will not be dedicated to the Lord <u>unless WE show them that WE are dedicated to the Lord</u>.

"And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might" (Deut. 6:5).
