who hath sorrow? who hath contentions? who hath babbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of eyes? They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine. Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, when it giveth his colour in the cup, when it moveth itself aright. At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder. Thine eyes shall behold strange women, and thine heart shall utter perverse things. Yea, thou shalt be as he that lieth down in the midst of the sea, or as he that lieth upon the top of a mast. They have stricken me, shalt thou say, and I was not sick; they have beaten me, and I felt it not: when shall I awake? I will seek it yet again" (Prov. 23:29-35). "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit" (Eph. 5:18). "Be SOBER, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour" (1 Pet. 5:8, emphasis mine, TCG). If we must be sober, and alcohol affects our sobriety, then what does that say about alcohol?

We must be diligent to always emphasize the dangers of this destructive vice that has damaged so many lives throughout the centuries.

Be Angry and Sin Not Chase Green

"Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another. Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: Neither give place to the devil" (Eph. 4:25-27).

It is not inherently sinful to be angry. I know that for two reasons: 1) Eph. 4:26 implies this, and 2) our Lord Jesus Christ was angry (Mark 3:5), but never sinned (1 Pet. 2:21-22). What IS sinful, though, is to let your anger be the CAUSATION of sin. In other words, do not allow your anger to lead to wrath (See Jms. 1:19; Rom. 12:19-21). Another thing I need to consider regarding anger — I had better not be angry with a brother without cause: "But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca (insulting someone by calling them "worthless," TCG), shall be in danger of the council (the Sanhedrin, the Jewish council in charge of the death penalty, TCG): but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire" (Mat. 5:22).

Yes, we must make sure that we do not allow our anger to cause us to sin. But there are two other main points that this passage is teaching as well. These two teachings revolve around 1) Truth, and 2) restoring Christian relationships.

"Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbor." Why? "For we are members one of another." Because members of the church have this intimate spiritual relationship with one another, why would we ever want to speak ill about one another or diminish one another's character without cause? This sin is also known as "gossip," or "slander," or "backbiting," and has caused a lot of damage to the Lord's church throughout the centuries. See Eph. 4:31-32; 1 Tim. 5:13; Prov. 10:18. Therefore, I must be very careful with my tongue (Jms. 3:1-12).

Secondly, the Ephesians passage teaches about restoring Christian relationships. "Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: Neither give place to the devil." The Devil is an expert in creating grudges between brethren. He loves when brethren are at odds with one another. If he can split the brotherhood, he's won half the battle. Many church splits occur not over doctrine, but over personality conflicts and animosity. The Devil loves to have it so. Therefore, we must not let the sun go down on our wrath.

Did you know that we cannot worship properly while being at odds with a brother? "Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar (worship, TCG), and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee; Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift" (Mat. 5:23-24). When the inevitable problems do arise in our Christian relationships, we simply MUST do our due diligence to reconcile with our brethren if at all possible, to not let the sun go down on our wrath.

Well, how do we go about that? The Lord Himself gave us very specific instructions on exactly how to do it in Matthew 18:15-20. Go to the brother or sister in person. If he or she refuses to hear, take two or three witnesses with you. If he or she still refuses to hear, take the whole church. If he or she still refuses to hear you, "let him be unto thee as an heathen man and a publican." In other words, that person has voluntarily removed himself from the fellowship, and we must withdraw from him. But this is never done without first a lot of "blood, sweat, and tears" trying to reclaim the erring one!

The three sins listed in Ephesians 4:25-27 (lying which leads to gossip, sinful anger, and refusal to attempt reconciliation with an erring brother or sister) all have the power to cause great harm to the Lord's church. Let us make sure that we heed the words of Paul so that we can maintain proper Christian relationships and maintain unity in the Lord's church, to the best of our ability.
